In February 2007, a serious automobile accident took place in southwest Washington. <u>A twelve-year-old boy was at the wheel of an SUV</u> when he lost control and struck another vehicle. According to the sheriff's office, "Excessive speed appeared to be a factor in the crash." I dunno, I think a major factor is that *a twelve-year-old was behind the wheel*.
