## Why don't the shortcuts I put in the CSIDL\_COMMON\_FAVORITES folder show up in the Favorites menu?

A customer created some shortcuts in the <code>CSIDL\_COMMON\_FAVORITES</code> folder, expecting them to appear in the Favorites menu for all users. Instead, they appeared in the Favorites menu for <code>no</code> users. Why isn't <code>CSIDL\_COMMON\_FAVORITES</code> working? The <code>CSIDL\_COMMON\_FAVORITES</code> value was added at the same time as the other <code>CSIDL\_COMMON\_\*</code> values, and its name strongly suggests that its relationship to <code>CSIDL\_FAVORITES</code> is the same as the relationship between <code>CSIDL\_COMMON\_STARTMENU</code> and <code>CSIDL\_STARTMENU</code>, or between <code>CSIDL\_COMMON\_PROGRAMS</code> and <code>CSIDL\_PROGRAMS</code>, or between <code>CSIDL\_COMMON\_DESKTOPDIRECTORY</code> and <code>CSIDL\_DESKTOPDIRECTORY</code>. That suggestion is a false one. In fact, <code>CSIDL\_COMMON\_FAVORITES</code> is not hooked up to anything. It's another of those vestigial values that got <code>created</code> with the intent of actually doing <code>something</code> but that thing never actually happened. I don't think any version of Internet <code>Explorer</code> ever paid any attention to that folder. Maybe the designers decided that it was a bad idea and cut the feature. Maybe it was an oversight. Whatever the reason, it's just sitting there wasting space. Sorry for the fake-out.

**Exercise**: Another customer wanted to know why creating a %ALLUSERS-PROFILE%\Microsoft\Internet Explorer\Quick Launch directory and putting shortcuts into it did not result in those shortcuts appearing in every user's Quick Launch bar. Explain.
