## More notes on use of the DS\_CONTROL style



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Here's a follow-up on some old articles on the DS CONTROL dialog style and avoiding accidental control ID collisions.

When you add the DS\_CONTROL style to your dialog template, there are other changes to the dialog styles which come into play. Some are mandatory, some are automatic, and some are optional.

**Mandatory**: You *must* remove the ws\_POPUP style and you *must* add the ws\_CHILD style. If you omit the ws\_CHILD style or accidentally specify the ws\_POPUP style, then the dialog won't be created as a child window of the parent window you specified.

**Automatic**: You *may* remove the WS\_CAPTION and WS\_SYSMENU styles. The dialog manager removes them automatically, so this isn't a requirement, but you are welcome to remove them yourself, either to avoid confusion or out of a sense of cleanliness.

**Optional**: You have the option of adding or removing the ws\_VISIBLE and DS\_MODALFRAME styles, depending on the behavior you desire.

If you specify WS\_VISIBLE, then the child dialog will be created visible. Otherwise, it will be created hidden.

If you specify DS\_MODALFRAME, then the child dialog gets the WS\_EX\_WINDOWEDGE extended style, which gives it an extra outer edge border. If you want the child dialog to blend in seamlessly with its parent, then you probably want to remove that style.
