How do I know when the user has finished interacting with the AccountsSettingsPane?

The AccountsSettingsPane. Show method shows the accounts settings pane and returns immediately. How do you know when the user has closed the pane?

If the user selects one of your commands, you get a notification in the form of the Invoked event on that command. But what if the user closes the pane without selecting anything?

Instead of using the AccountsSettingsPane. Show method, use the AccountsSettingsPane. ShowManageAccountsAsync method. The ShowManageAccountsAsync method does the same thing as AccountsSettingsPane. Show, except that it returns an IAsyncAction which completes when the pane is closed (for whatever reason).

(Dirty secret: Really, it's the other way around. The AccountsSettingsPane.Show method just calls the AccountsSettingsPane.ShowManageAccountsAsync method. and throws away the IAsyncAction.)
